WAITIO CLASS

The Waitio whanau have done an amazing job of home learning. The photos, emails, communication and commitment to learning has not gone unnoticed. So a big THANK YOU to all the whanau for supporting the children over the last 5 weeks. I am so excited to have the children back at school and I'm sure they have loved being back with their friends.

It was wonderful to see the range of learning experiences that the children were involved in. Children have been practising maths, handwriting, reading, writing and also had a little introduction to learning about the solar system. It was great to see children's hands-on experiences as well, such as eeling, baking, making volcanos, making rockets, learning through play, shooting targets, riding horses and playing with siblings.







It has been rewarding to see the children in a different light and have the opportunity to learn more about their strengths and interests. I could see there was so much learning happening from all of these experiences.







It was lovely to see some of the children during the Zoom sessions. It was a great way for them to see each other and to be able to share what they had been doing.





Learning has certainly been very different during this time - This is what Alexia had to say about learning from home and being at school:



Learning from home: "It was fun because when you were hungry you could go to the pantry and eat something. It also felt weird because we weren't at school".

At school: "It was funny

because we are used to having lots of children at school. It felt strange playing with your friends 2 metres apart".

KIWIRUA CLASS

Children are so resilient and it's been obvious during the levels 3 and 4 of our national lockdown. From the moment our Government announced the lockdown our Pukehāmoamoa community - students, parents and teachers were ready to adapt to a different way of school life, from home.

We saw an increase of technology for communication and learning, meaningful and spontaneous learning experiences from home, zoom meetings, and lots of talks about bubbles, social distancing and metres.





Our Kiwirua parents stepped into the role of an educator where they provided a range of learning opportunities, whether that be through intentional lessons, spontaneous collecting and finding of items, baking, conversations, ANZAC learning, star gazing, exercise, drawing, treehuts, sleep overs in lounges and tents, education TV etc. All children were exposed to authentic experiences.





















Then we moved to level 3. We had a small bubble of students at school. They felt a range of emotions about coming back to school:

"Happy because I got to see my friends."
"Weird because we had to go in the senior room"

"Excited because I haven't seen friends in a long time."







"Being back at school was weird because we didn't know what to do. The next day we knew what to do and what doors to go in. We did skipping, art, maths and made a lockdown diary."



He waka eke noa – we are all in this together




OREKA CLASS

Check out some of the work I was able to capture during this time!


























A MESSAGE FROM OUR BOT

This group will continue the running of successful events held in the past, such as quiz night, as well as looking for opportunities and ideas for new fundraising.


